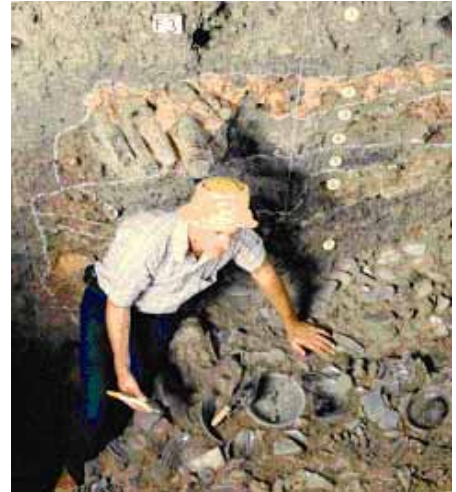

## **Development and Production of Ceramics in Southeast Asia**

This talk will address aspects of ceramic history in Mainland Southeast Asia with an underlying thesis that much more information lies beneath the ground.

Questions such as origins, source of influence, pathways of technological dissemination, the movement of potters, and change over time, will be discussed. There will be presentation of examples of historical sites that reveal the history of ceramics in Southeast Asia.

#### **About the speaker**

Dr. Don Hein has spent many years in Southeast Asia studying ancient kiln sites in Thailand, Burma and Laos, and has visited China, Vietnam and Cambodia including taking part in the 2007 excavation of the Mount Kulen Sar Sie kiln site near Angkor.

In addition to working in Thailand during the 1970s, he was the site director for archaeological projects in Thailand (TCAP) 1980-87, Laos (LAAP) 1988-91 and Burma (MAAP) 1988-2003.
