Rose Kerr is currently working on a book on export ceramics for the V&A, and has made some discoveries there of ceramics purchased in the early 20th century in SE Asia, with interesting documentation. The lecture will discuss ceramics in the collection made for, or purchased in, specific different markets.

**About the Speaker:** Rose Kerr is an expert on East Asian art and design. She retired as Keeper of the Far Eastern Department at the Victoria & Albert Museum in London, and acted as President of the Oriental Ceramic Society. She has also worked at the Percival David Foundation of Chinese Art in London, and at the University of Sussex, and is currently an Honorary Associate of the Needham Research Institute in Cambridge, Honorary Fellow at the University of Glasgow and Chairman of the Great Britain-China Educational Trust. Author of and contributor to many books, she is currently researching and writing two new books on Chinese export porcelain. Her most recent volume is the bilingual *Song China Through 21<sup>st</sup> Century Eyes*, published in November 2009 (information @ [www.meijeringartbooks.com](http://www.meijeringartbooks.com)).
