## Repairing Broken Pots

All collectors fear damage to their treasured objects and both Eastern and Western cultures have developed mending techniques. For some, the purity of an unblemished piece is important. Others laud the affordability of a pot with a minor chip or crack. Others still enjoy the history of an item that displays its wear and tear with pride. What can be mended, and how? And to what extent should restoration deceive the eye into thinking an old object is as good as new? Is there even a virtue in intentionally breaking pots to create something completely different? These, and related questions, will form the basis of this illustrated talk.

Our guest speaker, Jane Dorner, is not a professional conservationist but a UK-based author, writer, designer, and consultant. She has, however, mended a number of vessels and figurines over the last 15 years, and will take us through the various stages of how it is done.
